LATN203: Understanding Spoken Latin

Instructor: Prof. Vicki Wine (Office WH 115A, 9 – 9:30 A.M. Th)

Course Goals: to develop listening skills in Latin and to comprehend spoken Latin

Text: Student's selection. In place of the final, the student may select to present a project to the class.

Format:

Each class session will present audio recordings of the *Disce* lectiones. In addition, Forum Romanum videos and other activities including music using spoken Latin (like Mozart's "Requiem"), oral dictation exercises, and recordings of Latin sentences and conversations will offer a variety of listening experiences.

Grading: The total accumulation of points from fill-in exercises for each class will determine the final grade. The final will allow for make-ups, retakes, and additional points, up to a full grade higher than the average already achieved at the end of the course. In place of the final, the student may select to present a project to the class. First-year Latin students will be graded at one grade level lower than the students at reading level.
