

# INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS SUGGESTED SCHEDULE

Courses are listed in the earliest semester in which it is recommended that they be taken. In most cases, the courses may be taken in a later semester without serious consequence. See the notes below for recommendations related to individual courses. The following courses are required: Math 106, Business 105, 211, 212, 218, 290, 305, 306, 307, BUSI 345, ECON 360, Accounting 203, Economics 200, Intermediate Economic Theory (Econ 301), POLS 270 or POLS 366, HIST 319, ECON 351, International Business Capstone-409.

## Helpful Tips:

BUSI 105 should be taken in the 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. In most cases, this should be the first course in the program.

MATH 106 should be taken in the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> semester.

BUSI 211 and 212 should be taken in the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> semester. Normally, BUSI 211 and 212 are taken after MATH 106.

ECON 200 should be taken in the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> semester.

Normally, ACCT 203 is taken in the sophomore year (3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> semester).

BUSI 218 should be taken during the sophomore year (3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> semester).

BUSI 305 should be taken as soon as possible after BUSI 105 and ECON 200 (3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> semester).

BUSI 307 should be taken after BUSI 105 and ECON 200.

BUSI 306 should be taken in the junior year or 7<sup>th</sup> semester.

The Intermediate Macro-Economics requirement (ECON 301) should be taken in the 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> or 7<sup>th</sup> semester.

The capstone course BUSI 409 should be taken in the 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> semester. The core courses at the 300 level (ECON 301, BUSI 305, 306 or 307) are prerequisites for the capstone.
