This production is entered in the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival (KCACTF). The aims of this national theater education program are to identify and promote quality in college-level theater production. To this end, each production entered is eligible for a response by a regional KCACTF representative, and selected students and faculty are invited to participate in KCACTF programs involving scholarships, internships, grants and awards for actors, dramaturgs, playwrights, designers, stage managers and critics at both the regional and national levels.

Productions entered on the Participating level are eligible for inclusion at the KCACTF regional festival and can also be considered for invitation to the KCACTF national festival at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC in the spring of 2009.

Last year more than 1,300 productions were entered in the KCACTF involving more than 200,000 students nationwide. By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.



Nicky Silver: (Playwright): is an American playwright. Formerly of Philadelphia, he resides in New York City. As a teen, Silver attended Stagedoor Manor Performing Arts Training Center in upstate New York. He began writing after graduating from the New York University (NYU) Theatre program. His plays *Pterodactyls* and *Raised in Captivity* received back-to-back Drama Desk Award nominations for Outstanding Play in 1994 and 1995, respectively. Pterodactyls gained additional recognition in the media because the play was produced with large dinosaurs.

"I worry about everything," he said one recent afternoon in a rehearsal room at Playwrights Horizons. "Everything, everything, everything, everything, everything. I worry about things that have no relationship to me whatsoever." (Excerpt from interview with Nicky Silver in the <u>NYTimes</u>)
