

From the Clipboard of the Director

I suspect many directors have "5 shows in their hip pocket," that is, a short list of plays they would like to direct someday...this is one of mine...

Originally produced in the mid 1930's, the show created quite a stir. No legal mention of homosexuality or lesbianism was allowed in New York, and the original stage director made certain that all of the actresses were at least 18 to avoid any allegations of contributing to the delinquency of a minor. My research for the show suggests that Lillian Hellman herself had many (sometimes conflicting) feelings about the show and its characters, and it was interesting to look at the various rewrites for stage (early 1950's) and film (40's through the early 60's).

The W.I.T. Studio Theatre has been an excellent venue for this play—this is an intimate, almost private look at people's lives, and the performers have created some nuanced and subtle interpretations I hope you will enjoy.

In the ideal, educational Theatre exists to serve our students, our audience, and our community. Prof. West (and many others!) has worked hard to bring the important issues and themes raised in the play to our collective attention; if this is both excellent theatre and a chance to consider appropriate responses to illumined problems, we all will have done our jobs.
